## Create a EURO 2017 poster

Look online at posters used to encourage people to vote or to fight in the First World War. Which posters do you like best? Why?

Can you grab people's attention and tell them the what, why, how, when, where and who about EURO 2017? Can you use the power of words and an image to change what people choose to watch or do? Your poster will help inform people about EURO 2017 as well as challenge attitudes to the game.

## Five tips:

- 1. Build your poster around a one-line message in big lettering to grab people's attention
- 2. Make every word count. The more words you use the less people will want to read it
- 3. Use one image or two. No more
- 4. Be controversial. But not too controversial
- 5. Think of who will read the poster and what will appeal to them
