

Example resource: Poetic techniques card sort

Supports Lesson 4 in the *Write On* scheme of work

Alliteration	Repetition
Simile	Metaphor
Caesura	Enjambment
Stanza	Sibilance
Structure	Rhyme scheme

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Consecutive words beginning with the same letter or sound.	Saying the same word or phrase a number of times to create emphasis.
Comparing two different things using the words 'like' or 'as'.	A comparison saying that something is something else.
Punctuation in the middle of a line, that stops the poem flowing.	No punctuation at the end of a line of poetry.
Another word for a verse.	The repeated use of the 's' sound, creating a hissing sound.
The way in which a poem is laid out.	The way that a poet makes the poem rhyme.
