Friday 30 April 2021 would have been Captain Sir Tom Moore’s 101st birthday. It is also the one-year anniversary of the extraordinary celebrations following the conclusion of his famous 100 laps of his garden that raised an incredible £38.9 million for the NHS.

Celebrate Captain Tom’s amazing achievements in a special event over his birthday weekend from Friday 30 April to Monday 3 May. Here are several activities from the National Literacy Trust that your class can do in school or at home around the number 100.

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| Write down your 100 favourite book characters – either on your own or in a group of friends | Write a 100 word book review of a book you’ve read recently or one of Captain Tom’s books | Listen to an audiobook for 100 minutes |
| Read 100 pages of a book and tell somebody else about it | Find out how to write one hundred in five different languages – or even 100 different languages! | Do some research into an event that happened around 100 years ago and write a short summary |
| Read a book with ‘hundred’ in the title e.g. <i>100 Brilliant Poems</i> , chosen by Paul Cookson or <i>The 100</i> by Kass Morgan. Look for other books with numbers in the title. | Write about what you think the street you live on will be like in 100 years | Write a story about travelling 100 miles: where are you going? What happens along the way? |
