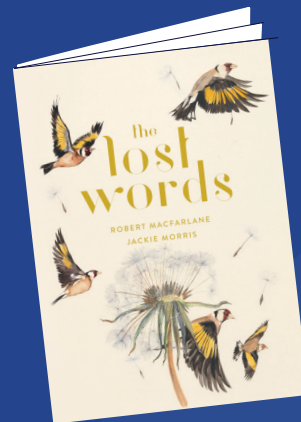

Introduce new words into the conversation. When you use a new word, explain what it means. If your child is interested, encourage them to do some research about the word when they get home.

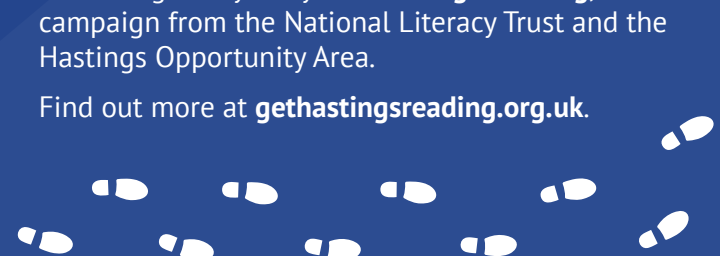
Talk about the day on your way home. Ask your child which part of the trail they enjoyed the most and what their favourite new word is.
