#### Poetry Is More Than Life To Me

Poetry and expression saved my life and gave me perspective and love for myself. All those years of being a teenager, hating life, wanting to die and wondering how I was ever going to get out of the dark places: that seemed a lifetime ago.

It all changed when I reached my twenties, and started getting into performance art. Writing my experiences down, sharing them and receiving applause – just the clapping of hands switched my vibration, turned my frown upside down. I am passionate about sharing the beautiful wisdom I have been so blessed to find, to share it with other young people, sharing what was my fate, and the negative mind-set I was once in.

Expressing oneself is so important: to release, to feel, to be heard and to be valued. As humans we're all trying to find our place, to understand who we are. I grew up in public, on mics and with audiences I aired my life and received love back.

Red Jen believing in me created a massive ripple effect 'cause I shared that love and belief with so many other young people as a result. I ran a poetry event called 'Lyrically Challenged' at Passing Clouds, a well-known venue in Dalston which like so many other important London venues, was recently closed down (despite our protests). Each month, I challenged two poets to write a new piece on a theme set by me. One month the challenge was to write a piece on human trafficking. It all took place in the upstairs of Passing Clouds, its wooden floors stripped bare, with fairy lights all over the place; a bar that looked like a ship; sofas everywhere and a homely atmosphere.

To run a poetry event is to give people a voice, to let them be heard in a safe environment; to let them grow with love and without judgement. Words are power and collectively, when we join our minds together, we create a revolution. Collective consciousness is strength: bringing poets and free thinkers together changes our world; we feel the force of life and the force of our oneness, which is shared with so many people.

Sometimes I see life as a crossroads: I can walk down the street and see a shadow of myself, a ghost of who I could have been, walking parallel to me on the streets of London. I see a homeless girl, lost out of her mind on the roads tryna find her soul through drugs. And I walk in real life next to her, an MC, a poetess, an actress living a life with beautiful people. I feel grateful every day that I found this place, this wonderful world filled with magic, I'm still living in the blocks but I'm out of the cage.

London and life: a heaven or hell, depending on the glasses we wear for the day. I choose to see the love and beauty. Poetry and self-expression are the tools for me to find those things, to find that heaven; so poetry is more than words: it is my healer, it is my mother and father; it is love in my veins. I give thanks.
