The zoo's owner, Doug Bos, said:

"We made a mistake. I'm embarrassed about it. Every time we take an animal off the property, we're supposed to notify the Fish and Wildlife department, send them an email, and we forgot to do that. This proves that there are strict regulations. When you make a mistake, you have to pay for it."



Serena Bos, a bear trainer at the zoo, said:


"There was never any public present. It was done long before the Dairy Queen even opened. Berkley is a captive bear, so not a wild bear in any way."

Jacob Ford, the 17-year-old who used the microwave to carry his books, said:

"First of all, I wrote a 3000 word document. After that was ignored, I started the next stage of the peaceful protest. On Monday, I carried my books in a wicker basket and on Tuesday, in a saucepan. Wednesday was sandwich bags with a padlock. Thursday was the backend of a lawnmower and Friday was the microwave. Paying for a new bag which fits the school's updated policy is outrageous."



The school said:

"Younger students have been injured because of really large bags being carried on shoulders. Therefore, bags of any size may be used to bring books and kit to and from school, but bags are not allowed in lessons during the day."



Headteacher Steven Wilkinson said:

"The facts that have been presented do not give the full picture of this story. The student has behaved in a very inappropriate way."
