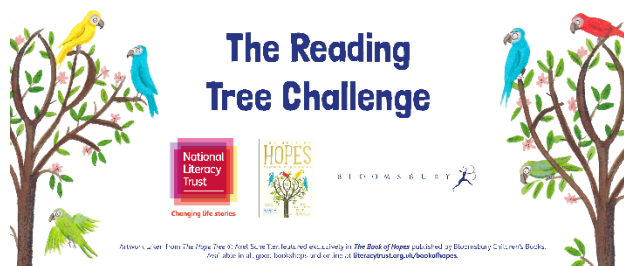


Reading Challenge: terms and conditions

The Reading Tree challenge from the National Literacy Trust



Rules for entry

These terms and conditions apply to the Reading Tree challenge. The promoter is the National Literacy Trust.

1. National Literacy Trust Reading Challenge are open to all UK schools. Schools may run the challenge without choosing to enter the prize draw.
2. The eligible age range for participants will be advertised on the challenge web page: the Reading Tree challenge is designed for students between the ages of 5 and 14 years.
3. Reading Challenge prize draws are free of charge to enter.
4. The closing date for entries is **Friday 27 November 2020** and no entries will be accepted after this date.
5. To be entered in the prize draw a member of school staff must email competitions@literacytrust.org.uk providing both:
 - a) full contact details, including their name, school name, and a contact email address
 - b) evidence of participation in the form of photograph(s) of completed Reading Tree posters and leaves.
6. Incomplete, illegible or corrupt entries, or those not in accordance with entry instructions, will not be accepted.
7. All eligible entries will be entered in to a prize draw, with a winner chosen at random.
8. The winning school will receive a box of books for their school library or classroom book collections.
9. The prize is non-transferable and non-exchangeable. However, in the event of unforeseen circumstances the promoter reserves the right to offer alternative prizes of equal value.
